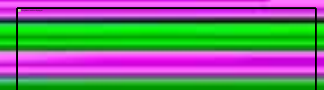


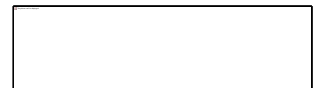

Permanent Residence Options

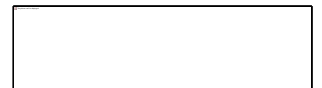
Federal

- Express Entry*
- Start-Up Visa Program

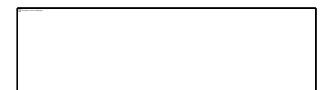
AINP Streams & Categories

- Employer Driven Stream
 - Skilled Worker Category
 - Semi-Skilled Worker Category
 - International Graduate Category
- Strategic Recruitment Stream (SRS):
 - Compulsory and Optional Trades Category
 - Engineering Occupations Category
 - Post-Graduate Worker Category



Finding Your National Occupational Classification (NOC) Code & Skill Level

- NOC is a system that describes occupations
- Occupations are classified as:
 - Skilled
 - 0 - Management occupations
 - A - Occupations usually require university education
 - B - Occupations usually require college or vocational education or apprenticeship training
 - Semi-Skilled
 - C - Occupations usually require secondary school and/or occupation specific training
 - D - On-the-job training is usually provided for occupations

Skilled Worker Category

Skilled Worker Category Criteria

- Employer supported
- Skilled occupation (NOC 0, A, B)
- Permanent and full-time job offer
- Related education, training, work experience
- Additional AINP requirements for some occupations
 - e.g. Early Childhood Educators and Child Care Staff



Semi-Skilled Worker Category

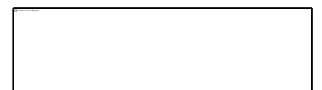
Semi-Skilled Worker Category

- **Eligible industries:**
 - Food and Beverage Processing
 - Hotel and Lodging
 - Manufacturing
 - Long-Haul Trucking
 - Foodservices (pilot project)



Semi-Skilled Worker Category Criteria

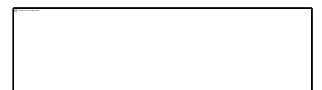
- Select semi-skilled occupations in NOC C and D
- Working in Alberta on a work permit for an eligible AINP Semi-Skilled Occupation
- High School education
- Official language ability requirements
- Meet additional criteria required for your industry



Food and Beverage Processing Industry

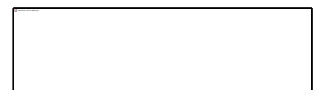
Eligible occupations:

- Bakery Production Worker (NOC 9617)
- Food and Beverage Production Worker (NOC 9617)
- Food and Beverage Processing Equipment Cleaner (NOC 9617)
- Industrial Butchers and Meat Cutters (NOC 9462)
- Poultry Production Worker (NOC 9462)



Food and Beverage Processing Industry Criteria

- High School education
- Three years of work experience in a similar job prior to arriving in Canada
- Three months work experience in Alberta
- Must complete an interview with Alberta Agriculture and Forestry regarding your suitability for the AINP
- Proof of language ability

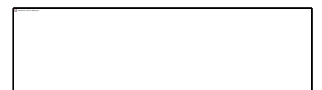

International Graduate Category

International Graduate Category Criteria

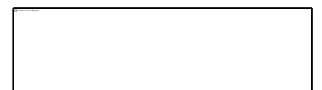
- Graduated in Canada
- Minimum one year (or two semesters of full-time study) in duration
- Working full-time in Alberta for the employer supporting your AINP application
- Permanent, full-time job offer
 - NOC 0, A, B or C
 - If NOC C, must meet language requirements
- Current and valid Post-Graduation Work Permit



Strategic Recruitment Stream

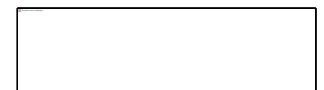
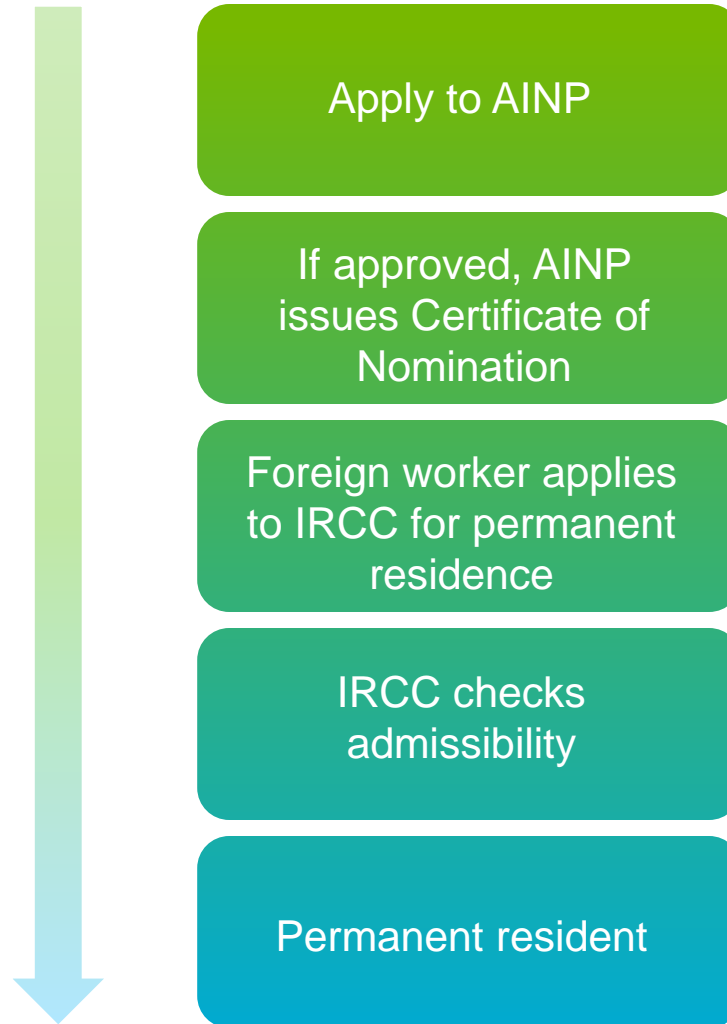
Post-Graduate Worker Category

- Must be currently working in Alberta in an eligible NOC 0, A, B or C occupation
- Must have a valid Post-Graduation Work Permit
- Must have a degree, diploma or certificate from an AINP-recognized institution in Alberta
- Program of study must have been at least one year (or two semesters of full-time study)
- Some occupations are not eligible



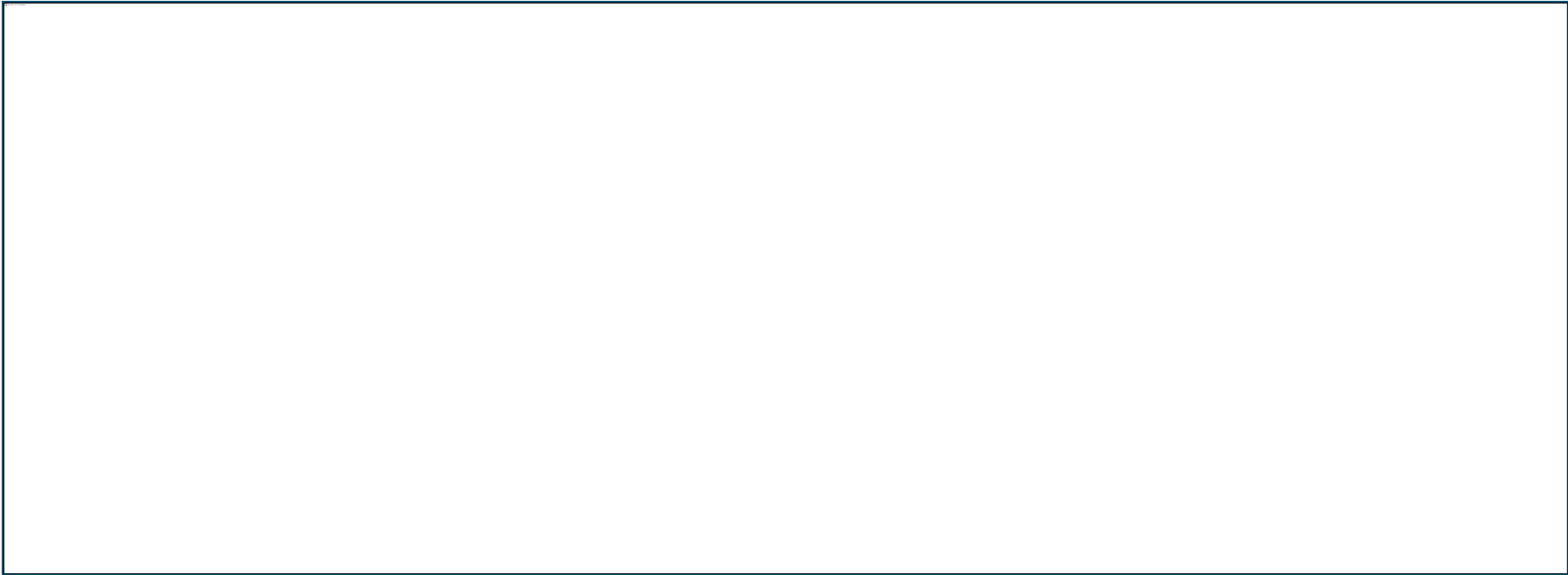

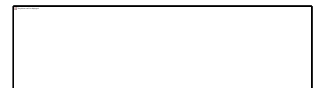
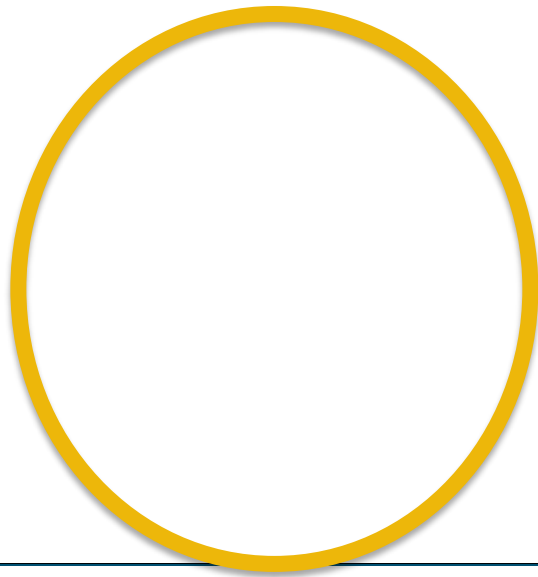
